MSN Admission Criteria

- A BSN from an NLNAC, ACEN, CNEA, or CCNE accredited nursing program at a regionally accredited institution
- Current unencumbered Compact State Registered Nurse (RN) license
- Licensure as an unencumbered Registered Nurse in Pennsylvania (PA) or will acquire PA license prior to either Leadership or Education track clinical hours/practicum courses.
- An undergraduate grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicants with a GPA below 3.0 may be admitted on a probationary basis.
 *Students admitted on probation will be considered for full admission after satisfactory completion of six credits of graduate coursework with a grade of B in each course.



MSN Admission Criteria

- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended.
- A 250 to 500-word personal statement concerning the student's interest and reason for applying.
- Professional résumé.
- Interview may be requested by the School of Nursing

MSN Program

- Two tracks: Education and Leadership
- Prerequisites: Undergraduate Nurse
 Leadership, Research, Community Health,
 and Statistics
- Courses offered over 12-15 week Semesters
- Online asynchronous courses
- Total of 33 credits (10 courses) and 500 clinical hours for each track

- NURS 662 Education Practicum (250 clinical hours) (6 credits)

- NURS 665 Leadership strategies (125 clinical hours) (3 credits)
